The Baby Point Gates Parkette project began on June 8, 2011 and was officially completed on December 30, 2013 – images below. It celebrates both the centenary anniversary of the Baby Point Gates, erected in 1911 by architect Robert Home Smith, and the formation of the Baby Point Gates Business Improvement Area in 2011.
